It is very important to have good communication so that we can work together and keep Beauregard Parish Roads as safe as possible. This is a request to use a specific route of travel when using Parish roads for the purpose of logging or other continuous hauling of materials. In the "Conditions of Permit" attached, you will find the requirements of the permit.

Please fill out the highlighted areas and the Public Works Department will review your request and contact you either by email or phone with the approval of your selected route or a changed route if necessary. A permit number will be assigned in order to manage the permits issued by the Parish.

There is no cost for this permit.

CONDITIONS OF PERMIT

The logging foreman shall notify the Parish Road Foreman before the logging operation begins and again when the logging operation is ending. The shoulder of the road and the roadside ditches shall be restored to their original condition, or better, before logging equipment is removed from the job site.

The logging foreman shall notify the Parish Road Foreman of any area on the Parish road that needs repair. (This is not to place blame on the logging operation, but to expedite repairs on the road before additional damage takes place.)

Trucks shall not be loaded on the road right of way.

Binding of loads shall not take place on the road right of way.

Trimming of loads shall not take place on the road right of way.

Loading and unloading of equipment shall not take place on the road right of way.

Unless the access from the logging road to the Parish road is at the top of a hill, a culvert shall be supplied and installed by the contractor in the roadside ditch. The diameter of the culvert shall be sufficient to carry the drainage of the roadside ditch. The minimum length of the culvert shall be 30 feet and shall be placed in a way to minimize the turning movements of the log trucks on the Parish road. If the access of the logging road is at the top of a hill, the contractor shall take steps to prevent damage to the road and the shoulder of the road at this access point.

The logging foreman shall make every effort to minimize turning and twisting movements and abrupt starts and stops on Parish roads by log trucks and logging equipment.

A copy of this permit shall be available at the job site.

Failure to comply with the conditions of this permit shall result in the permit being revoked.
